



Are you a responsible recycler?

Recycling plays a part in reducing waste in your area. Did you know you are able to recycle right at the Lehman Township Municipal buildings? We take aluminum cans, tin cans, specific plastics, cardboard and paper. We are proud to be able to provide this low-cost service to Lehman Township residents as well as surrounding community members. Permits are just \$25 per year for non-township residents and are available beginning December 1.

The biggest problem with todays recycling is what people are calling "wishful recycling". Wishful recycling is where good intended people send items to be recycled because they believe or hope they are recyclable, but they aren't. This creates an abundance of problems, including higher recycling prices due to added manpower. Simply look on the container to see if it is recyclable, rinse the item and remove the lid/cap before tossing in into the recycling bin. 
